Geography has been defined as The Whyness of Whereness. The purpose of this class is to study and understand sustainable development through the physical, historical, and cultural in components of our world and its societies. Relationships between people, places, environments, and their impact on world cultures and events will be explored. There will be an added emphasis on Sustainable Development, which essentially means we will apply what we study by exploring ways of being respectful toward the earth, its resources and toward other people. We will begin our study of the world by focusing on change agents and local physical and human geographical phenomena. Then we will apply the Geographic Perspective on diverse countries and regions of the world. Second semester will begin by exploring the religions, their places of origin, beliefs, and their place in history. We will study early civilizations, Classical Eastern and Western civilizations, Twentieth Century History and Globalization.

This class will be infused with real-world international collaboration projects. Students will learn multiple perspectives through working and collaborating to be active participants in their global and local communities. Meaning, they will be working with students around their own age in countries around the world. In this section of World Studies students will learn how to read, write, and speak basic Hangul (Korean), as well as East Asian culture & history. Students will read: *Long Walk to Water, When My Name was Keoko, The Chosen, My Name is Malala*, and another book of their choice.

This will be a rigorous course where students will be expected to think and apply what they have learned, not just memorize and repeat.

Absent Work:

Students are responsible for any assignment that are posted on my website on the due date or the day they return, unless they have contacted me.

Students & parents need to plan ahead when they plan to be absent.

Late Work:

All late work will be assessed with an 'interest incurring late fee' policy. Meaning each day the assignment is late a student will need to 'pay' a late fee - Points from the assignment will be deducted each day the assignment is late.

- 1. Late and extra-credit work is **ONLY** accepted in order to bring a student's grade up to a B or up to 80-84%.
- 2. Points or Credit will be deducted from all late work. My policy is that I take 10 % off every school day, not every A or B day but every day school is in session. So if an assignment is five days late (5 x 10% = 50%), after 2 weeks no credit will be given.
- 3. Completion of all late work is the responsibility of the student. Late work will be graded in the same amount of time that it was turned in, so if the assignment was 3 days late, the teacher has 3 days to turn in the assignment.
- 4. No late work will be accepted the last week of the term.
- 5. No extra credit [Enrichment Activities] will be accepted the last 2 weeks of the term.

Assessments: (70%)

Assessments can include paper/ pencil tests, reports, essays, projects, presentations, and even a conversation where you clearly show me that you understand and have mastered a standard. This includes self assessments.

Authentic assessment measures

Assignments: (10%)

This portion of your grade will be mostly in class work and practice for the summative assessments. It will also include in class starters, exit slips, current events, study guides etc. Smaller class projects may be included in this portion of your grade where larger projects based on learning objectives may be included in the assessment grade.

Participation/Behavior: (15%)

Part of our job in a junior high is to teach you how to live in the world. We want you to have great habits when you get to high school, college, and when you get a job! In our class, there will be behavior as well as academic standards. You will get a rubric explaining what is expected of you. You will start out with a 4 and I will regularly (every 1-2 weeks) update that grade to reflect your current behavior in class. That grade will also determine your citizenship grade.

Enrichment Activities: (5%)

Create opportunities for students to take ownership of the learning process by requiring them to pose their own questions, research and develop their own theories, and conceptualize their own learning projects. One project a term must be completed after basic content mastery in order to receive an A and extra credit.




